First Responder Loves Encinitas

National Emergency Medical Services (EMS) week is May 20-26, 2007, and San Diego Medical Services Enterprise (SDMSE), Encinitas' 911 ambulance provider and chamber member, would like to introduce you to one of your local emergency responders, Thea Barsalou, who will give advice on how to be better prepared for emergencies at your place of business.

Barsalou has been a paramedic in San Diego County for about 20 years, the past five of which have been spent in Encinitas. Though she currently resides in Carlsbad, Barsalou has lived in Encinitas at various times in her life.

"Working in Encinitas is wonderful," said Barsalou, who is stationed at Encinitas Fire Station 4 on Village Park Way when not working special assignment at EMS headquarters. "The (Encinitas) Fire Department's professionalism goes above and beyond. They really help the citizens."

"Encinitas has a small-town friendliness, but really it's quite a large city," Barsalou added.

Barsalou said she has been on many 911 responses at businesses in Encinitas. She recommends the following to make an emergency response to a business run smoother.

- Bystander CPR and Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) are critical for patients suffering sudden cardiac arrest. Become CPR certified and install an AED in your business. (for more information visit www.sdprojectheartbeat.com)
- Be trained in basic first aid skills to be able to assist in an emergency before paramedics and EMTs arrive on scene.
- Barsalou is one of more than 400 SDMSE emergency responders giving the highest level of emergency medical patient care throughout San Diego County.

SDMSE is a public-private partnership between the City of San Diego Fire-Rescue department and Rural/Metro ambulance. In addition to serving the city of San Diego, since 2001, the county of San Diego has contracted with SDMSE to provide all ambulance service to County Service Area 17, a territory that encompasses Encinitas, Del Mar, Solana Beach, Rancho Santa Fe, and 4S Ranch.

National EMS week is an annual event to recognize the contributions of all of the women and men running the emergency medical services system. These include paramedics and EMTs, fire department first responder crews, dispatchers, mechanics, emergency room staff, and administrative support personnel- everyone who runs this extensive system 24/7, 365 days a year to protect the community.
